Introduction

Christian Brothers College scholarships celebrate the vision of our College Founder Blessed Edmund Rice, who valued access to and engagement in a quality Catholic education for all children. Our scholarships are open to new and current students of Christian Brothers College and are available in the following categories:

- Academic Scholarship (Year 7 or Year 10)
- Edmund Rice Scholarship (Year 7 to 12)
- Indigenous Heritage Scholarship (Year 7 to 12)
- Music Scholarship (Year 7 to 10)

Eligible students are expected to demonstrate a positive contribution in all aspects of College life including actively supporting and engaging with the Catholic ethos of the College and co-curricular activities.

All CBC scholarships provide up to 50% remission of tuition fees for the duration of the student's enrolment at the College and are reviewed annually.

The final selection of scholarship recipients is at the discretion of the College Principal. Unsuccessful applicants will be notified by mail prior to Friday 3 May 2024.

Academic Scholarship (Year 7 or Year 10)

CBC is offering Academic Scholarships to students entering Year 7 or Year 10 in 2025. These Scholarships are also open to current CBC students.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of results from the CBC Gifted and Talented Assessment process, and at the discretion of the Principal. The assessment will be held at the College on the morning of **Saturday 16 March 2024**.

To apply for an Academic Scholarship

- **Current CBC students entering Year 7 in 2025** will automatically sit the Gifted and Talented Assessment in February 2025 as part of our regular student academic evaluation process and may be offered a scholarship based on their results. Completion of the Scholarship Application is not required.
- **Current CBC students entering Year 10 in 2025** can apply for a CBC Academic Scholarship by **completing the Scholarship Application Form** and will be required to sit the Gifted and Talented Assessment on Saturday 16 March 2024. Payment of the \$50 Application Fee is not required.
- **Students not currently at CBC, entering Year 7 or Year 10 in 2025** may apply for a CBC Academic Scholarship by **completing the Scholarship Application Form** and will be required to sit the Gifted and Talented Assessment on Saturday 16 March 2024. Payment of the \$50 Application Fee is required but will be refunded if the student enrolls at CBC at a later date.

Edmund Rice Scholarship (Year 7 to 12)

Through Edmund Rice Scholarships, the College supports new and current students who would otherwise not have the opportunity or means to attend CBC. This scholarship commemorates the vision and life of our Founder, Blessed Edmund Rice and reflects the College values of Faith, Excellence, Community and Compassion.

To apply for an Edmund Rice Scholarship

- Please complete and lodge the Scholarship Application form.
- You may include evidence of community involvement and other individual achievements.
- For students not currently at CBC please also complete and lodge an online Application for Enrolment form with the supporting documentation. This application can be accessed on the College website at <https://www.cbc.sa.edu.au/enrolment-application/>
- You may be asked to submit an Application for Reduction of School Fees to enable an informed and confidential assessment of your family's financial position. Our Finance Department will be in contact if this is required.

Edmund Rice Scholarships cover a percentage of tuition fees and therefore families are responsible for the payment of the additional resourcing of their son's education for items such as uniforms, IT levy, VET and interstate/overseas trips.

All scholarships are reviewed annually for the duration of the scholarship.

Indigenous Heritage Scholarship (Year 7 to 12)

Recognises students with Indigenous heritage who will contribute positively to College life. Priority is given to those families in financial need. The scholarship is open to new and current students entering Year 7 to 12 in 2025.

Music Scholarship (Year 7 to 10)

The Music scholarship program recognises students with exceptional music talent who will enhance the College Music program. The scholarship is open to new and current students entering Year 7 to 10 in 2025.

The scholarship is awarded based on:

- Proven potential in music.
- Practical audition – a performance of two contrasting pieces on the main instrument or voice. A prepared scale at the student's level also needs to be presented, and some sight-reading will be completed as part of this process.
- Rhythm and aural testing, and an interview.

Eligible students are expected to demonstrate a positive contribution to all aspects of College life and to support the Music Department through participation in at least two co-curricular ensembles including choir and performance activities of the College.

To apply for a Music Scholarship

- Please complete and lodge the Scholarship Application form with documentation to support the music scholarship application, such as music exam results.
- For students not currently at CBC please also complete and lodge an online Application for Enrolment form with the supporting documentation. This application can be accessed on the College website at <https://www.cbc.sa.edu.au/enrolment-application/>

The Head of Music will review each scholarship holder's progress and contribution annually.

The Selection Process

The selection process will involve:

- Lodgement of all the required documentation.
- A review panel consisting of the College Principal and key staff, will assess each application based on commitment to Catholic education, merit of application and audition or interview where required. Auditions will be held between Monday 18 March 2024 – Friday 5 April 2024.
